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

- Students are invited to attend
- Each year addresses a different theme/challenge
- The event is publicised widely

2a: PROGRAMME LAB

- Two-day, off campus workshop for the teaching staff within one study programme.
- Exchange, discussion and workshops to develop better alignment of **all actors involved** in the programme.
- The objective is to exchange and balance pedagogical practices across the **programme**.
- Different staff categories are included
- External speakers may be invited
- Teaching and learning unit staff are included
- May be linked to course evaluation processes

2b: FUTURE WORKSHOPS

- Two-day workshop participants are teachers and/or students of one study programme.

- 3 **Realisation and practice** developing concrete actions
- Then ... implementation and follow-up
