#### Currency

Please remember to have Polish złoty (PLN) available if you are paying in cash. There is a bank at the airport if you need to change currency upon arrival. In addition, there are ATMs from different banks (in shopping areas, at the airport etc). You can also pay with your credit card in larger stores or restaurants.

#### Language

The official language of the Forum is English. No simultaneous translation will be provided.

#### Weather

The average temperatures in Warsaw in February are  $-2^{\circ}\text{C}$  to  $4^{\circ}\text{C}$ , so remember to pack warm clothing.

#### Voltage

Electricity in Poland is supplied at a 230 Volts 50 Hz system. Poland uses the Europlug (CEE 7/16), which is used in most other European countries. Visitors from the following European countries will

have to use an adapter: Italy, United Kingdom, Ireland, Cyprus, Malta, Switzerland, Liechtenstein, Denmark.

### Visa requirements

EU citizens do not need a visa and can travel into Poland on either a passport or an ID card. Non-EU citizens are advised to check the requirements on the [government website](#).
