CALL FOR CONTRIBUTIONS

The call for contributions to the <u>2019 EUA-CDE Annual Meeting</u> on "The societal dimension of doctoral education" is now open. The event will be hosted by the **University of Brescia** from **12 to 14 June 2019** in Italy.

The 2019 Annual Meeting explores the many aspects involved in doctoral education's contribution to society. Set within the broader context of the engagement of universities with partners in other sectors, the meeting will explore a variety of related topics such as the contribution of doctoral education to reaching the Sustainable Development Goals, the opportunities and challenges of science communication, inter-sectoral mobility and collaboration, career development, skill development for addressing global challenges, and societal impact and outreach.

Contributions should be **related to the topic** of the event. Themes can include, but are not limited to:

- New Skills to address future challenges
- Intersectoral mobility
- Citizen science
- Societal engagement
- Public outreach
- Dimensions of impact
- Sustainability and the Sustainable Development Goals

While, in general, contributions include a **short presentation (about 10 minutes)**, applicants are also encouraged to propose **alternative formats** like fishbowl sessions, world-café, etc.

Contributions will be reviewed based on the following criteria:

- The contribution has a clear focus that will be of interest to the meeting participants
- The contribution is clearly embedded in the thematic programme of the conference
- The argument and structure of the contribution is logical, coherent and understandable
- The contribution has the potential to start a lively debate
- Contributions presenting examples of institutional practices are critical and self-reflective



Applicants should note that the online proposal form will ask for the following information:

- Details of one presenter
- Details of an additional contact person and up to three co-authors (both optional)
- Theme to which the contribution relates most
- Contribution title
- Contribution summary (max. 50 words)
- Contribution outline (max. 800 words)

Participants presenting their contributions in a parallel session setting will benefit from one **reduced registration fee** per presentation but are responsible for their own travel and accommodation expenses. After submitting their contributions, participants are asked not to register for the Annual Meeting until the results have been announced. Participants entitled to a reduced registration fee will be asked to register through a separate registration process.
