

DFG

Germany's largest independent research funding organisation

- Total budget approx. € 3.2 billion in 2017
- ▶ In 2017, the DFG funded over 32,000 projects
- Funding is provided by:
 - German federal government (67,9%)
 - German states (31,2%)
 - Private sources (0.9%)




- Research topics: open, bottom-up, no thematic calls or target areas
- Evaluation through multi-level peer-review



DFG


the self-governing organisation for science and research in Germany

- Association under German private law
- Member institutions include:
 - universities
 - non-university research institutions
 - academies of sciences and humanities
 - scientific associations
- Advises parliaments and public authorities on scientific matters





DFGMission focus



The DFG

- ➤ Facilitates international cooperation among researchers in all funded projects
- Supports the dialogue between science, industry and society
- Promotes gender equality in the German scientific and academic communities
- ▶ Devotes particular attention to the education and advancement of earlycareer researchers



Research Training Groups (RTGs) Structured PhD training


- 5-12 Pls as supervisors
- Thematically focused interdisciplinary research and study programmes at universities
- ► Tailored study programme
- Regular, structured supervision of PhD students; mentoring programme
- Maximum funding period: 9 years
- Currently 221 RTGs funded: www.dfg.de/gk/en/





Research Training Groups (RTGs) Funding

- Three-year positions for 10-15 PhD candidates,
 - + max. 2 Postdocs
- Research Students (assistants)
- Consumables
- Support for coordination, recruitment, sabbaticals etc.
- Funds for scientific networking:
 - International Summer Schools & conferences
 - Invitation of guest scientists
 - Research stays abroad
- Dedicated support for PhD students with children





International Research Training Groups (IRTGs) Taking research collaborations one step further


- ▶ 5-10 PIs and 10-15 doctoral students on each side
- Joint research and training programme with a partner institution outside of Germany
- Added value through complementarity of expertise and resources
- International co-supervision and mentoring
- Research stay abroad (6-12 months)
- Complementary funding required





International Research Training Groups Global cooperation


➤ 39 IRTGs in 16 different countries = 17,6 % of 221 RTGs






(International) Research Training Groups (IRTGs) Societal Dimension

- ► Funding decisions based on scientific criteria
- Societal Impact not central in the evaluation of the research programme
- Qualification Programme: training of new skills (for different sectors); often including partners from industry
- Intersectoral mobility through "transfer projects" and/or industry internships









International Research Training Groups Benefits – for whom?

▶ Doctoral researchers

- Attractive, high quality research programme
- Structured supervision and training
- Access to additional resources
- International networking and visibility through mobility
- Intercultural competence / personal development





► Principal Investigators/Participating scientists

- Expansion of own research field
- Deepening existing and creation of new collaborations
- Increase of international visibility
- Access to additional resources (infrastructures etc.)

▶ Universities

- Building block for existing and new int'l cooperation agreements
- International visibility
- Internationalisation of the doctorate itself
- 22% overhead funding
