Policy labs

The LOTUS final conference is organised around 4 policy labs, to address different aspects of learning and teaching identified throughout the project as areas of common interest and challenge. The aim of each policy lab is to provide a set of key messages on how to support learning and teaching on a given topic.

The policy labs will be organised in the form of parallel sessions, requiring active participation from all. Participants will be asked to choose their preferred policy labs when registering to the conference.

During the **Parallel session I (28 September)**, participants will be introduced to the topic through a short input presentation, and will be invited to collectively design key messages on how to support learning and teaching development at institutional, national and European levels.

During the **Parallel session II (29 September)**, participants will switch to a different lab session and engage with the key messages designed by other colleagues during the first day of the event.

Each policy lab will be guided by two facilitators.

Policy lab 1. Adapting the educational offer: to what, to whom, and what does it mean?

session will look into issues such as the place of teaching in academic careers, professional development of teachers, and support and incentive measures for staff, with the ambition to make institutions' and teachers' views cross paths with policy-level perspectives.
