# Honours Programme for future Researchers: Target Group

- Application possible for outstanding bachelor and master students from all disciplines
- Students with particular interest in and considerable talent for research
- Conducting own research or publication project (either combined with bachelor/master thesis or extra project by choice)
- Support by a professor or postdoc/lecturer who will supervise the project
- Up to 75 students per year
- Selection process with senate committee



## Honours Programme for future Researchers: Goals

- Attract and support talented pre-PhD students
- Hands-on experience with research at an early stage, deeper insight into research processes
- Networking within the scientific community
- Interdisciplinary exchange with students and academics from multiple disciplines
- Key qualifications (i.e. good scientific practise, scientific presentations, time management)
- Informed decision for future career and PhD



# Honours Programme for future Researchers: Components

- Honours Mentoring: supervisor of research project as mentor; mentoring programme with training and guidelines for both students and mentors
- 2. **Honours Workshops**: workshops and other events to train research-related key qualifications and to reflect on their own research and research culture
- 3. Honours Funds: 1.000€ per year for research-related costs (material costs, travel expenses for conferences or research stays, books)



### **Critical points**

- Part of excellence strategy of Jena university (funded for 6 years)
- Expenses: Staff: 0.75 coordinator, 0.25 administration, plus ca.
  200.000€ for honours funds and workshops
- Administration: paying expenses for students
- How many students per year?
- What is obligatory, what is voluntary?
- Students' ideas, initiatives and peer networking
- Rooted in specific discipline (project, mentor, scientific community), but also interdisciplinary programme
- Role of professors and strategy of programme
- Application and selection committee



#### **RESULTS OF THE SURVEY OF SUPERVISORS:**

Of the 34 supervisors who participated in the survey, 20 are professors and 14 are postdocs. Overall Satisfaction with the Honours Programme (item 4) has not changed since the previous year and is high (M=4.4), the respondents consider the programme goals to be achieved (items 1, 2, 3):
