- Application via nomination by the prospective host organisation
- Separate applications for each candidate
- Coordinated submission of applications by applicant organisations
- Roles within the applicant organisation:
 - Primary contact point
 - Head of applicant organisation
 - Academic mentor
 - Candidate



MSCA4Ukraine – Application Requirements

Responsibilities of the **Primary Contact Point**

(International Office staff, grants management officer or similar):

- Coordinates application process for all candidates
- Serves as primary contact for MSCA4Ukraine consortium for application and funding
- Ensures compliance with MSCA4Ukraine ToR, including eligibility
- Ensures interview between academic mentor and candidate
- Verifies documentation on identity, academic record and relevant language proficiency of candidate
- For doctoral candidates: Ensures enrolment at applicant organisation
- Develops host organisation statement on support measures for candidates
- Initiates and completes application in the online application portal
- Ensures timely contribution of all parties involved



MSCA4Ukraine – Application Requirements

Responsibilities of the **Head of Applicant Organisation**

(Vice-Chancellor, Executive Director, President or similar):

- May be contacted by MSCA4Ukraine consortium in case of questions or concerns



MSCA4Ukraine – Application Requirements

Responsibilities of the **Academic Mentor**

(active researcher at the applicant organisation):

- Conducts interview with the candidate before application
- Provides confidential assessment of the candidate's academic profile, achievements and future potential, and of the quality of the research proposal
- Provides workspace and access to relevant research equipment
- Serves as primary academic collaborator/advisor (in case of doctoral candidates: supervisor) of the candidate
- Supports the candidate in successfully completing their research proposal and furthering their academic qualifications



MSCA4Ukraine – Application Requirements

Responsibilities of the **Candidate**:

- Provides relevant information and documentation to contact point for review, verification, submission through online portal
- Provides CV and list of publications (in separate documents) to contact point for submission through online portal
- Develops research proposal in agreement with academic host

MSCA4Ukraine – Evaluation and Selection Process

Step 1 Eligibility check: AvH ensures application are complete and meet eligibility criteria.

Step 2 Ethics Check: Where indicated by ethical self-assessment: detailed ethics assessment by applicant organization and candidate, clarifying required formal ethics approvals (approvals not required at application stage).

Step 3 Evaluation process: Three external evaluators review and score each application.

Step 4 Selection: MSCA4Ukraine selection committee awards fellowships based on evaluation results.

Step 5 Fellowship offers: Issued and implemented by AvH.

Step 6 Notifications to unsuccessful applicants: Issued by AvH.



MSCA4Ukraine – Evaluation Criteria

Postdoctoral Fellowships:

Excellence: 35%

Quality of the researcher's **professional experience, competences and skills, and potential** for future research accomplishment.

Quality of the researcher's **proposal in terms of originality and potential to create a significant contribution** to the respective field of research.



MSCA4Ukraine – Evaluation Criteria

Postdoctoral Fellowships:

Impact: 35%

Quality of the **host organisation’s plan for supporting the researcher**, including the quality and suitability of training and career development measures proposed and efforts to enhance temporary integration in the host country’s academic community, including plans to support access for fellows and family members to accommodation, medical services, schooling and other social supports.

Quality of measures proposed to **prepare for reintegration** (in the future, in most cases, beyond the fellowship, when safe conditions for return are met), including efforts to (remotely) **maintain and strengthen connections with organisations and researchers in Ukraine** while on the fellowship.

Quality of the explanation for the proposed fellowship duration in respect to the **specific needs and interests of the researcher**, and **advancement of the proposed research**. In the case of short-term fellowship requests (under 18 months), quality of the proposed measures to either (a) prepare for reintegration to Ukraine (where this is stated rationale for the short-term request) or (b) prepare for follow-up fellowship or position outside Ukraine after the short-term fellowship.



MSCA4Ukraine – Evaluation Criteria

Postdoctoral Fellowships:

Implementation: 30%

Suitability of the **professional match between the researcher and the academic mentor/host organisation** (work in similar areas of research, potential for mutual academic benefit).

Compatibility with the host organisation (departmental strength in the researcher's area, or alternatively a void that the research can successfully fill).



MSCA4Ukraine – Evaluation Criteria

Doctoral Fellowships:

Excellence: 35%

Quality of the **researcher's competences and skills, and potential** for future research accomplishment.

Quality of the researcher's **proposal in terms of a first independent contribution** to the relevant academic field.



MSCA4Ukraine – Evaluation Criteria

Doctoral Fellowships:

Impact: 35%

Quality of the **host organisation’s plan for supporting the researcher**, including the quality and suitability of training and career development measures proposed and efforts to enhance temporary integration in the host country’s academic community, including plans to support access for fellows and family members to accommodation, medical services, schooling and other social supports

Quality of measures proposed to **prepare for reintegration** (in the future, in most cases, beyond the fellowship, when safe conditions for return are met), including efforts to (remotely) **maintain and strengthen connections with organisations and researchers in Ukraine** while on the fellowship.

Quality of the explanation for the proposed fellowship duration in respect to the **specific needs and interests of the researcher**, and **advancement of the proposed research**. In the case of short-term fellowship requests (under 18-months), quality of the proposed measures to either (a) prepare for reintegration to Ukraine (where this is stated rationale for the short-term request) or (b) prepare for follow-up fellowship or position outside Ukraine after the short-term fellowship



MSCA4Ukraine – Evaluation Criteria

Doctoral Fellowships:

Implementation: 30%

Suitability of the **professional match between the researcher and the academic mentor/host organisation** (work in similar areas of research, potential for mutual academic benefit).

Compatibility with the host organisation (departmental strength in the researcher's area, or alternatively a void that the research can successfully fill).



MSCA4Ukraine – Evaluation, Scoring, Selection

- 3 external evaluators will review each application
- Documents-based evaluation – no interviews due to urgent need for fellowships
- Score of 0 (unsatisfactory) to 5 (excellent) for each of the three evaluation criteria
- Applications scoring above 70%/10.5 points in total will proceed to selection stage
- If several applications reach identical scores but can not all be awarded, selection committee decides → focus on impact, especially re-integration
- Unsuccessful applications above 70% will form a ranked reserve list in case grants are declined
- Redress procedure will be in place



MSCA4Ukraine – Evaluation and Selection Timeline

Three internal cut-off dates for applications:

- 11 November → funding decisions expected by end of January
- 9 December → funding decisions expected by end of February
- 9 January → funding decisions expected by end of March
- Adjustable based on rate and quality of applications
- Grants are made until funds are exhausted → early application is advised
