

#### What methods did we use: 1

#### One to one meetings with key colleagues

- Finalised the approach to the project
- Understood the culture at QQI

#### Survey of all units in QQI

- Identified existing good practices, for example, reviews
- Identified gaps in engagement, for example, international students
- Understood the challenges, for example, turnover of student representatives
- Identified benefits of engagement, for example,
- Understood the importance of student representative organisations, for example, USI

#### What methods did we use: 2

#### Consultation with heads of unit at QQI

- Discussed categorisation of work activities
- Ensured all work activities were covered






## What were the results of the working group: 1

#### What were the outcomes of the research

Amplifying good practice

We are promoting the good practice that is already happening in QQI.
Colleagues are happy to hear about this good work and get recognition for it.

Advancing the conversation

There are more and more conversations about student engagement internally and externally. It is moving higher up colleagues priority list.

Identification of areas for improvement

We have clear recommendati ons backed up by the research and suggestions on how to move forward. The recommendati ons come from colleagues and the working group

Centralised repository of practices and resources

We are in the process of finalising a report promoting current good practices within the organisation and resources to help colleagues engage with students going forward

Framework for student engagement

We have developed a series of guiding criterion to help all staff members of QQI to decide if they need to engage with students and if so, what they need to consider and do.

#### What we did with the results

Step 1: Assess if the matter for engagement impacts students Step 2:
Consider the mutual benefit and the impact of engaging with students

Step 3: Decide what category of work the matter for engagement is most closely related to

Step 4:
Consider the level of engagement required for the matter

Step 6: Decide on the reward for student contributions

Step 7: Reflect and share the successes and challenges of the engagement
