WHAT NEEDS CHANGING?

- Update to reflect latest developments
- Stronger reference to cross-cutting issues
- Complementarity with other tools/frameworks
- Support for internationalisation

The scope of the ESG is too limited

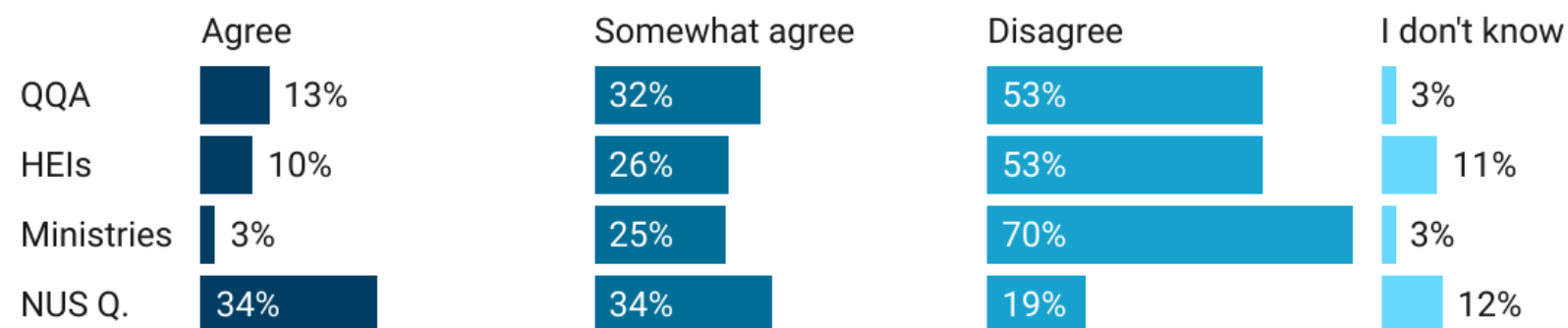
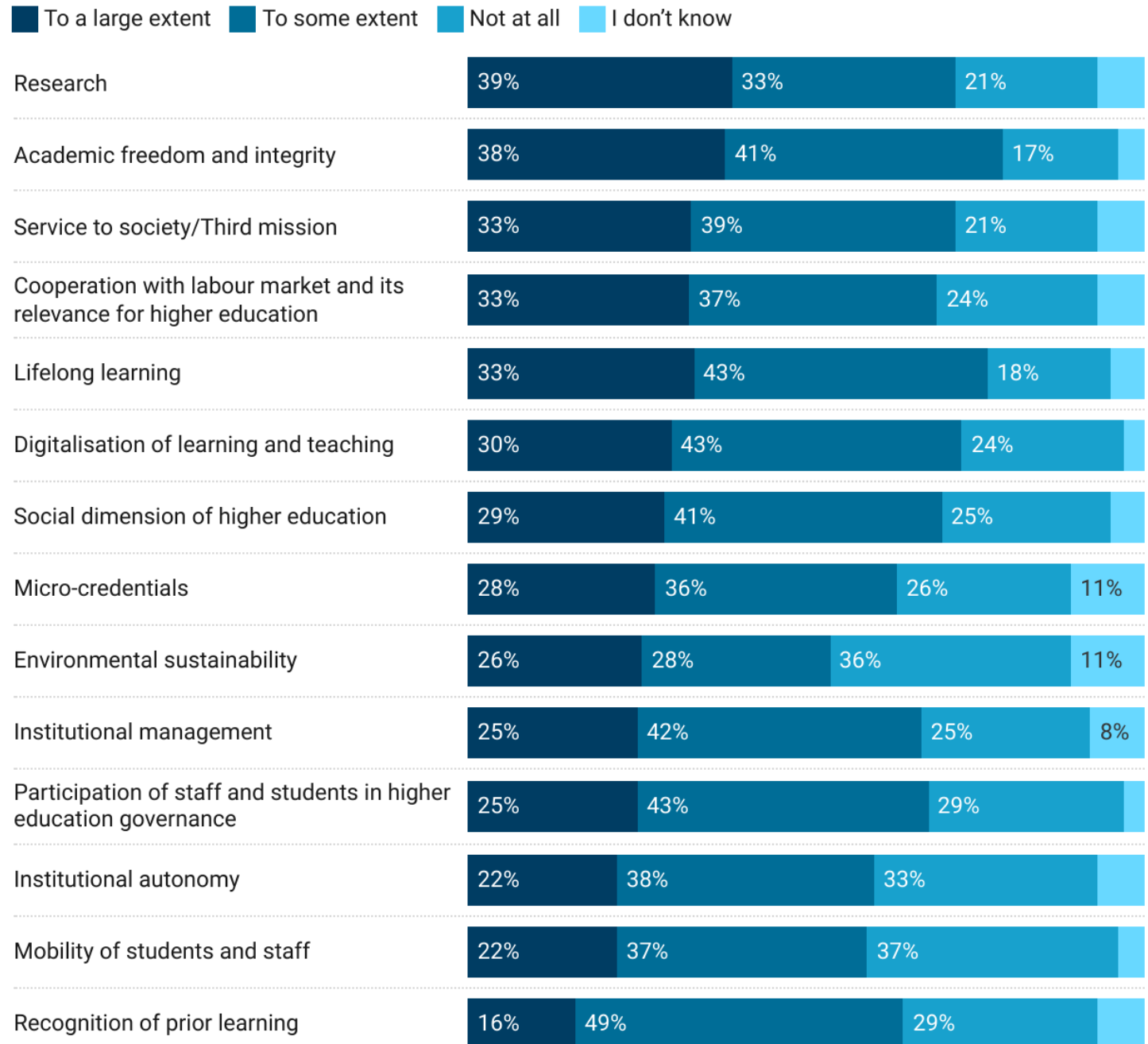


Chart: Q6. Please indicate your level of agreement with the following statements • Created with Datawrapper
