Getting around

By air

There are more than 120 <u>airlines</u> that serve Barcelona airport, which is located about 12 km of the city centre.

For public transport connections from the airport, please check http://www.aena.es/en/barcelona-airport/public-transport.html

There are taxi ranks opposite the arrivals areas of terminal T1, the Barcelona-Madrid shuttle, and terminals T2 A, T2 B and T2 C.

<u>L9 Sud metro line</u> connects the airport to Zona Universitària, stopping at Fira, Parc Logístic and Mercabarna.

Metropolitan bus lines run from the airport to central Barcelona and nearby towns. Intercity bus lines run from the airport to other places in Catalonia and other regions. There are also international buses to places in France and Andorra.

The local train service, <u>R2 Noth Line</u>, connects the airport to Barcelona and other towns in Catalonia.

By train

Barcelona has direct railway links with a number of European cities, and the high-speed train runs to Madrid, eastern and southern Spain. For more information, please check http://www.barcelonaturisme.com/wv3/en/page/32/train.html

By car

Barcelona is well connected. The most important motorways are the AP-7, N-II and C-32 that connect the city to France. The city is also connected to the rest of Spain through AP-7 and C-32.

By bus

Most national and international connections go via Barcelona Nord Bus Station. Buses also depart

In the city

If you plan to travel by public transport within Barcelona you can use the <u>Hola BCN! travel card</u>. This pass offers unlimited journeys on metro, bus (TMB) and the rest of the Barcelona public transport network from 2 to 5 consecutive days, with one ticket.

You can use your **Hola BCN!** pass at any time of day and get unlimited journeys over 48, 72, 96 or 120 hours from the first validation. The card is also valid for metro journeys from Barcelona Airport to the city centre and vice versa.
