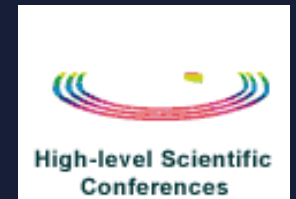

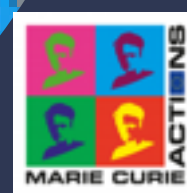

On August 31 2016 a note about the "**Innovative Doctorates**, the execution of the 2015-2020 National Program for Research" has been sent to the Rectors of Universities by the Italian Ministry of Education, University and Research (MIUR).

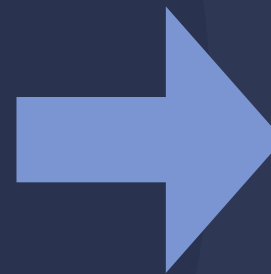
Cumulative or Additional Model: International COLLABORATIVE Doctorate

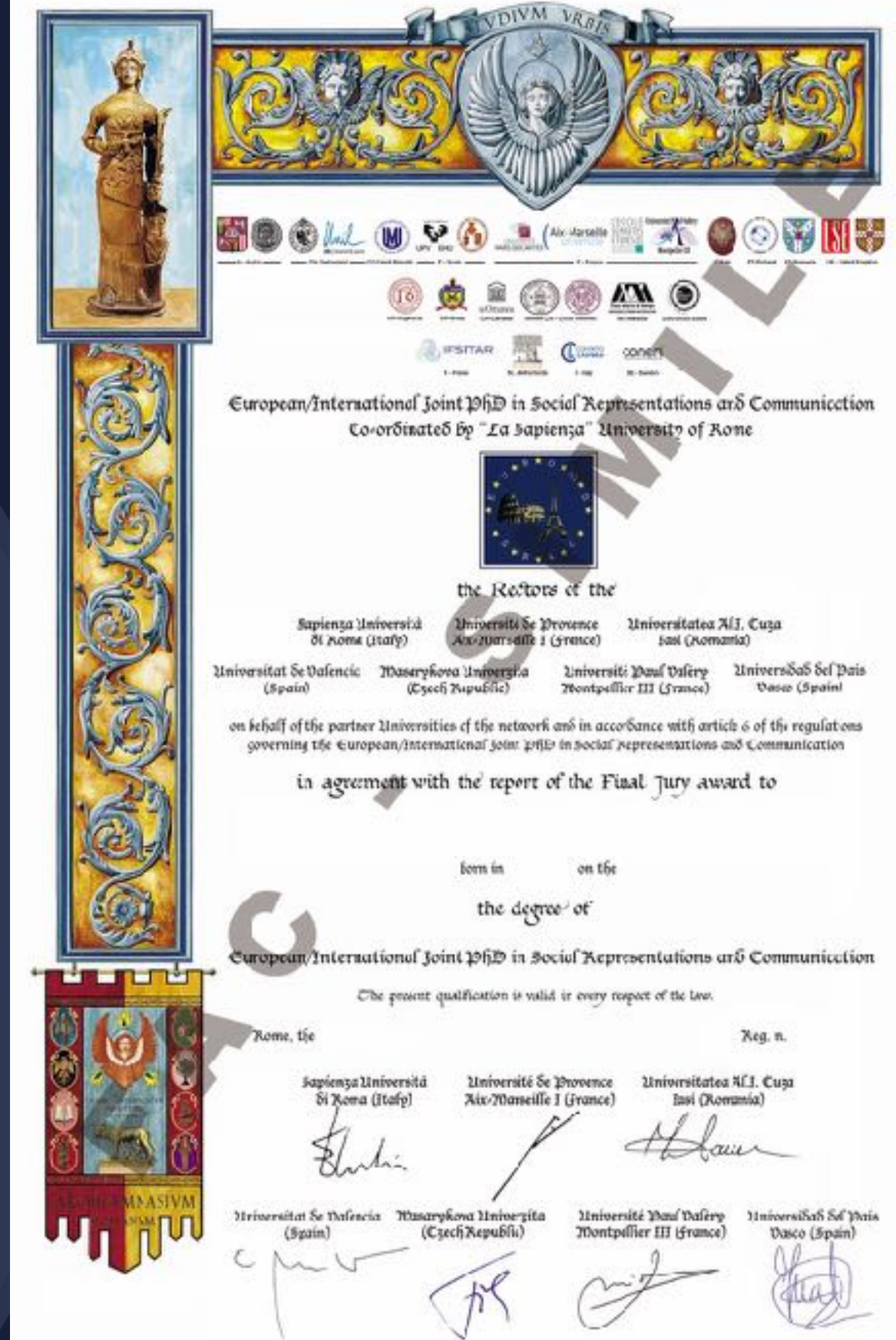
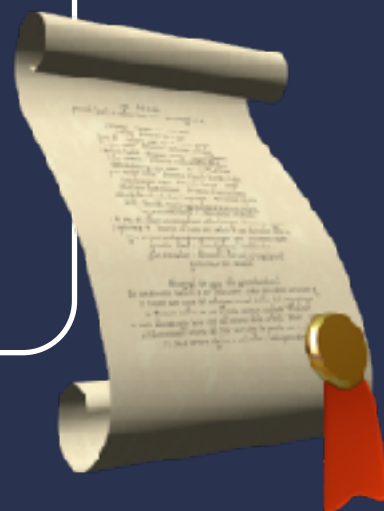

A JOINT International doctorate commits institutions to integrating all phases of planning, implementation and award of a joint diploma: Candidate recruitment, selection, admission, enrollment at the network level is just the first step and is no less important than the training in international settings to earn a joint diploma

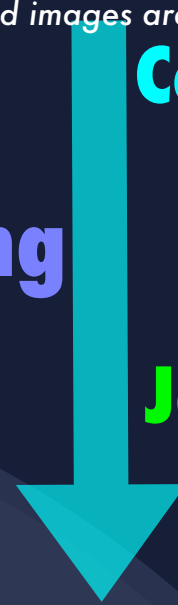

Born in 1993, it was an anticipatory experience of the Bologna process and of doctoral reform, still considered innovative (People 2013 ITN-Innovative Doctoral Program)

Jointly established quality criteria have been achieved for:

- **selection of candidates from all over the world**
- **high level training through joint European curriculum, integrating physical and virtual mobility of both the participants and the teaching staff**
- **research activity in an international environment**
- **intensive didactic 'stages' in multilingual and multicultural settings**
- **adoption of a specifically designed schema of structured training (E.C.T.S. without T)**
- **implementation of a language policy and format for the Ph.D. dissertation**
- **evaluation of the whole training process**
- **legal status of the qualification (formal recognition of the degree) and award of joint diploma**
- **enhancement of the career prospects both in and outside academia thanks to strong partnerships with private and small-medium enterprises and public research centres.**

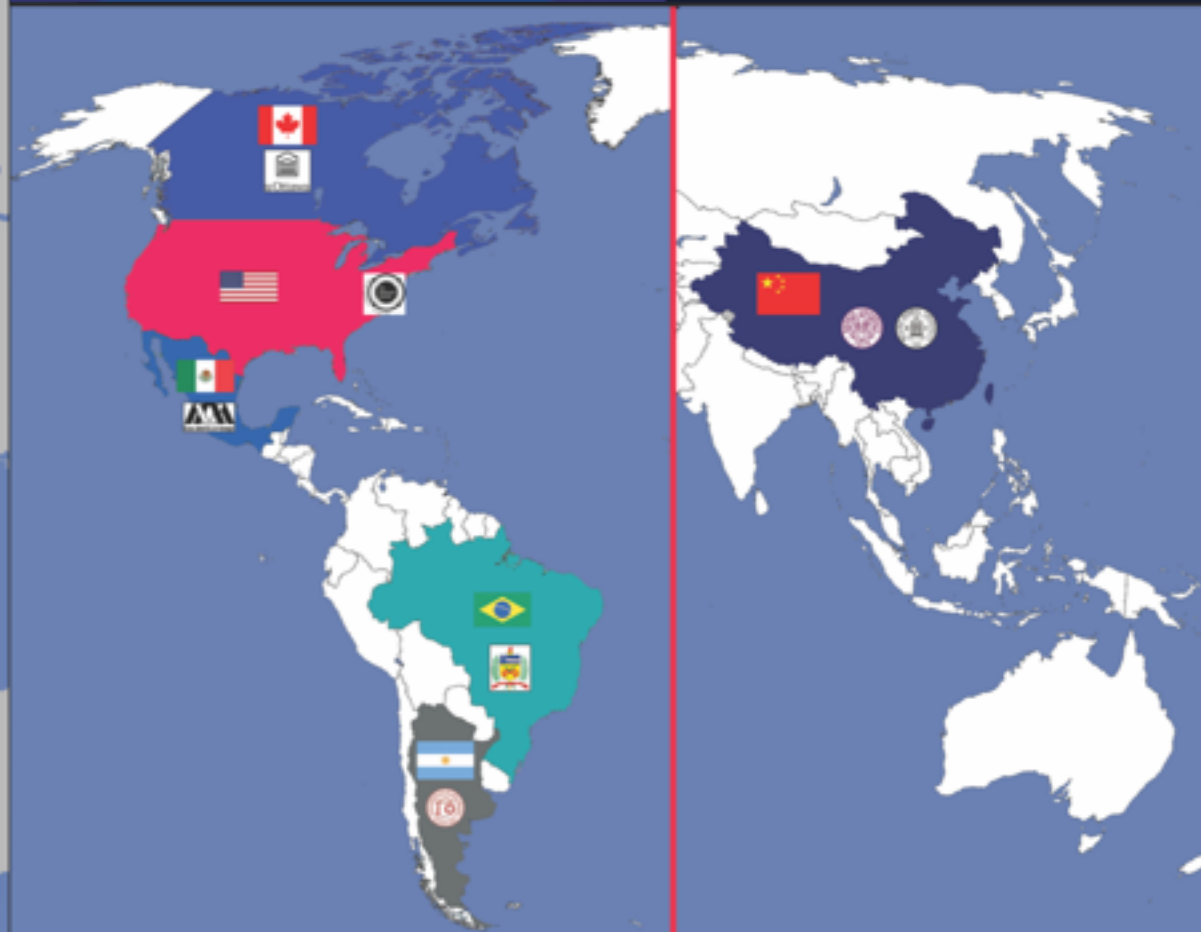

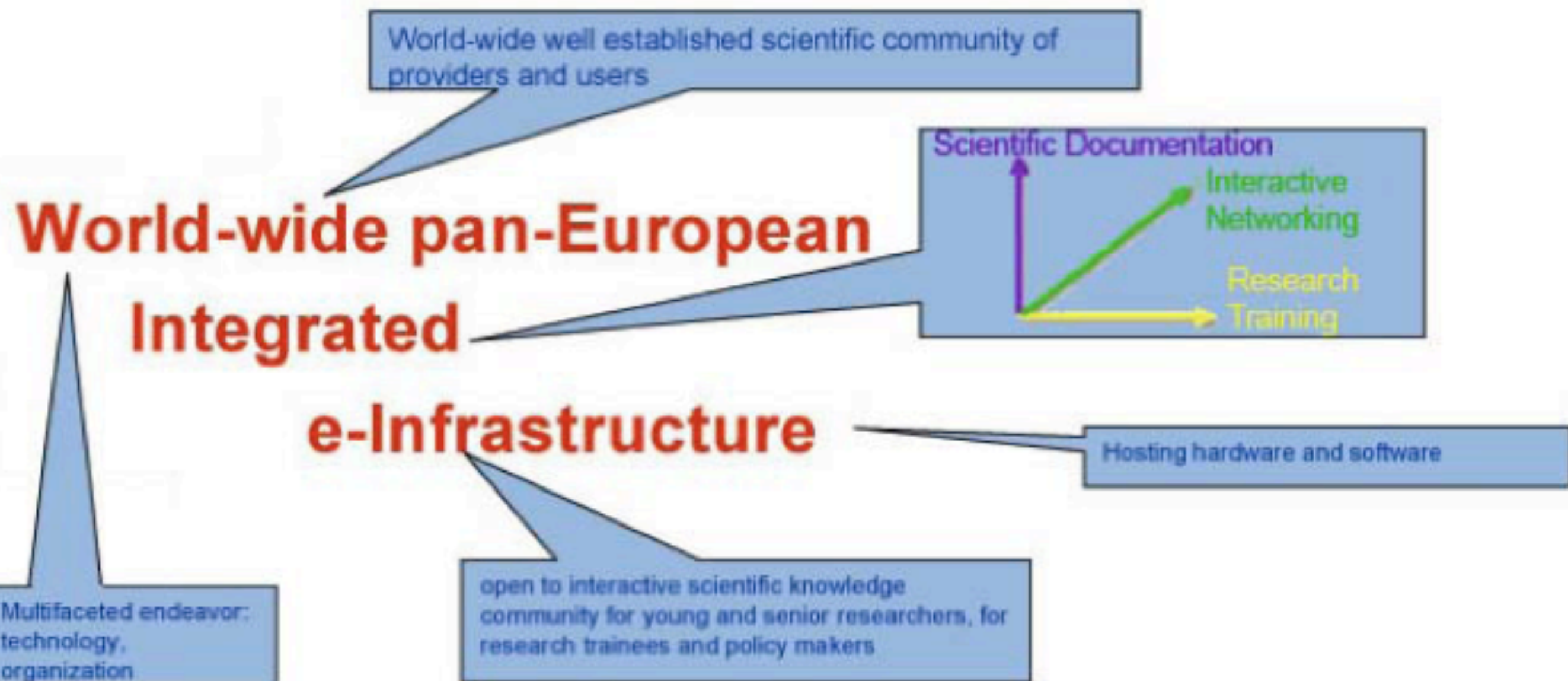

Social representation paradigms: one theory, different approaches and methods.



European Credit Transfer System (ECTS) adopted by the Euro PhD on Social Representations and Communication

Due to the integrated and joint nature of the programme, the adoption of **European Credit System** has been specifically designed as a system for credit accumulation, rather than a comparison of distributed teaching offers and transfer of learning outcomes. By conceptualizing the academic year not exclusively in terms of time, but in terms of earned credits, the system allows for flexibly meeting the needs of full-time and part-time research trainees.

In line with the policy recommended by EU DG-Education and Culture, the European Ph.D. adopted the European Credit Transfer System (ECTS) as an instrument for creating transparency and confidence in academic performance.

Research trainees are awarded up to 60 credits per year (20 for courses and didactic activities and 40 for research quality and related bibliographic knowledge).

The didactic structure within this overall strategy is highly innovative. As the system of **open distance learning** makes clear, European Ph.D. research trainees are involved in an interlocking system of **virtual and physical mobility** which allows for considerable **flexibility** in catering to research trainees' needs while at the same time guaranteeing individual **tutoring and interactive learning**:

Within the tutoring and co-tutoring triadic didactic system, **research trainees are required:**

- a) to spend at least 6 months researching in different European or Extra-EU countries (**PHYSICAL MOBILITY**).

This training is characterised by a multidisciplinary and multi-method approach. Each network university site has special expertise in a particular methodological approach to research in social representations. 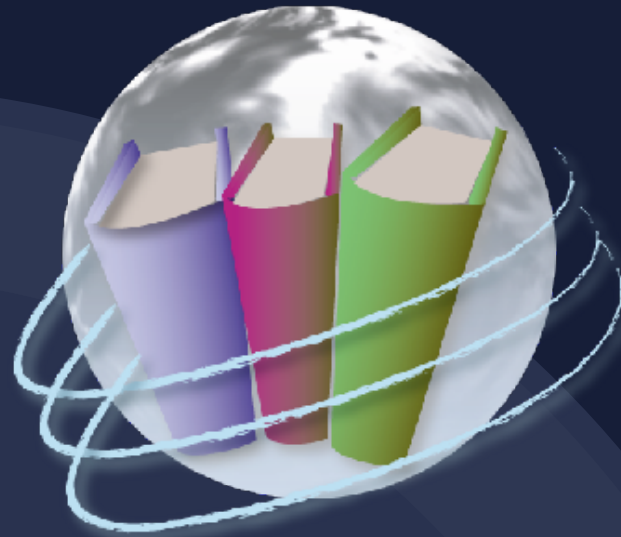
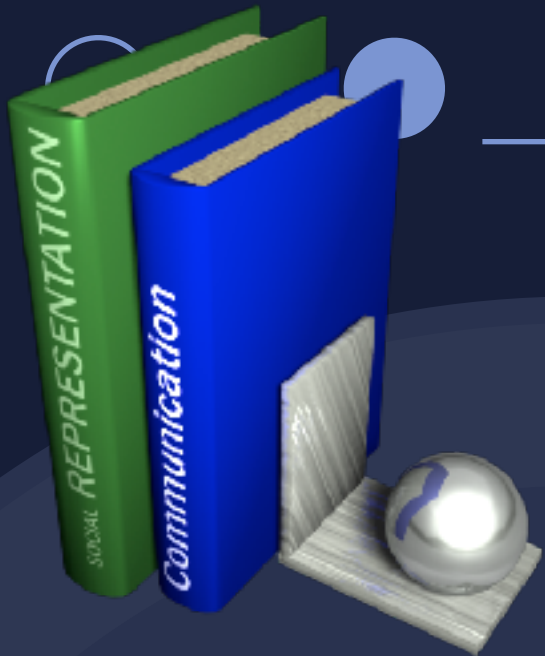
Intensive preliminary stage of bibliographic training at national universities (10 credits per year)

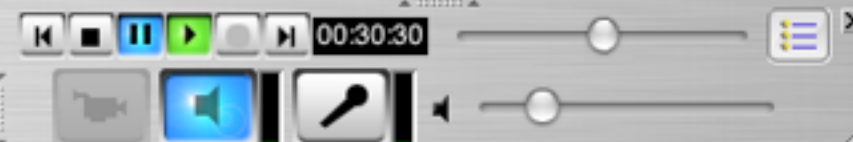
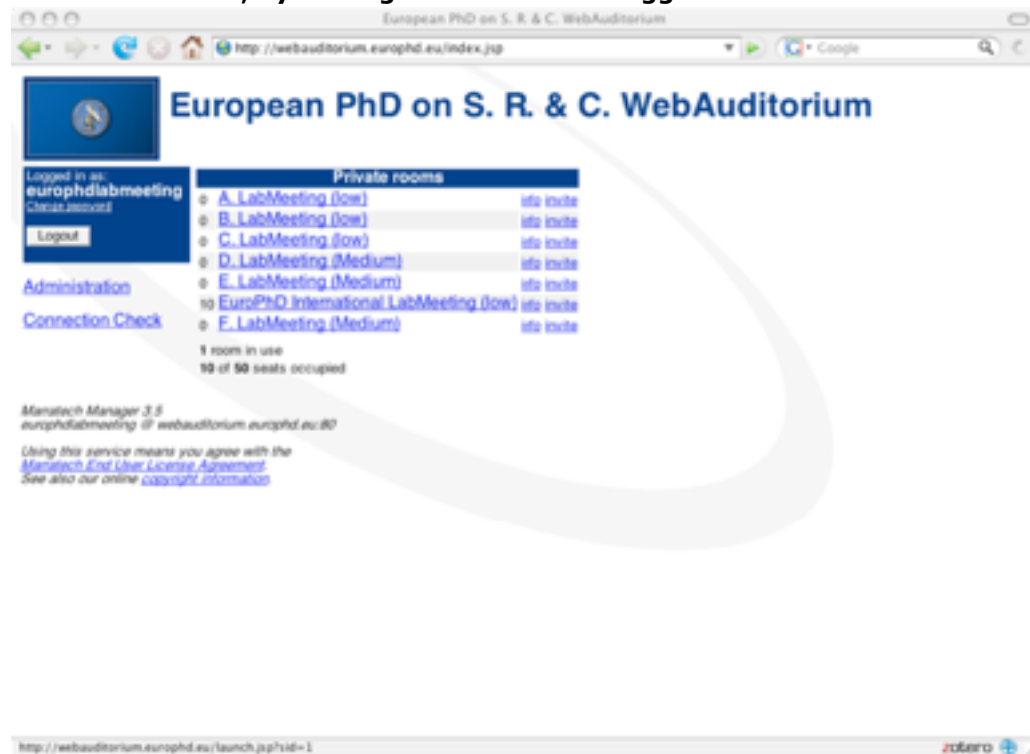


International Lab Meetings via Euro PhD web auditorium



Each session of the European Ph.D. International Lab Meetings includes two pilot tests before the events start aimed at verifying and assessing in advance the technical abilities of each participant. It provides two full days of basic and advanced training on the use of Marratech's programs. This includes an interactive test of the skills acquired by participants. Experience shows that after these sessions, participants, including senior professors unfamiliar with new technologies, are quickly able to actively participate in the event. Their presence visually, in text chat, their voices and videos and their interactive use of the *white-board* is warmly welcomed by all participants.

Indeed, the *white-board* allows interactive use not only among participants from in and outside the lab, but is highly functional for sharing applications and software. For example, this allows us for to hold advanced training sessions and collaborative learning on statistical packages by using data files provided by each participant. It is also interesting to use the *white-board's* share screen both for the participants' presentations (they start by locating themselves on the globe with an arrow and fill in whatever they believe best represents their identities) and for the collective evaluation of the event, by writing comments and suggestions on the shared screen.

DOUBLE FORMAT for the THESIS: Book and Article



- **BOOK FORMAT:**
the full report of the dissertation in a national language of the country where the doctorate is being pursued (site of the national tutor acting as main supervisor) or in English. This is to be evaluated by the national tutor.
- **ARTICLE FORMAT:**
a short version in English, which - upon agreement of the three tutors - should be evaluated by the International Evaluation Board (Final Jury) and deemed ready to be submitted to international journals.

ALTERNATIVE FORMAT for the extended version the 'three papers' PhD thesis



- **Under the 'three papers' model, a PhD thesis consists of three separate, publishable, papers of normal journal article length**
- **The papers are each free standing but should be on related themes**
- **The three papers are normally preceded in the thesis by a short Introduction to the overall topic, which may contain essential background information and followed by a Conclusion and implications for policy and/or further research**
- **The total number of chapters is thus usually five, and the total length approaches 150 pages.**

Lessons Learnt from the long running program



In order to **ensure its long term sustainability**, we had to learn **how to guarantee an effective management of a large network of institutions from three continents.**

The lessons learned do not only include **smooth administrative and organisational co-ordination**, also in relation to the **transformations in the network life-cycle** (ideation, creation, implementation, consolidation, recognition, enlargement and progressive development, sustainability....),

but also the **readiness to facing recurrent institutional obstacles and unexpected crisis.**

Lessons Learnt from the long running program

Recurrent institutional obstacles, among others factors, include:

- **persisting perception of the innovative program as exceptional case among the majority of traditional doctorates - even at the founding institution.** This occurs especially when there is a change in the administration leaders and officers. This minority perception – although counterbalanced by a positive connotation of *excellent minority* – indeed also effects ordinary administrative practices (for example:

- ★ the way in which the **data bases for assessment** are implemented;

- ★ the **practices differing from the traditional doctorates** regarding the call, the recruitment board, the final jury, the didactic structure, the management structure, etc.

- ★ **some misalignments between the normative dispositions regulating the majority of traditional doctorates and the innovative doctorates**, even when specific articles for the innovative doctorates included in the same regulation provide that they may follow the Inter-institutional agreements signed with the partners Institutions)



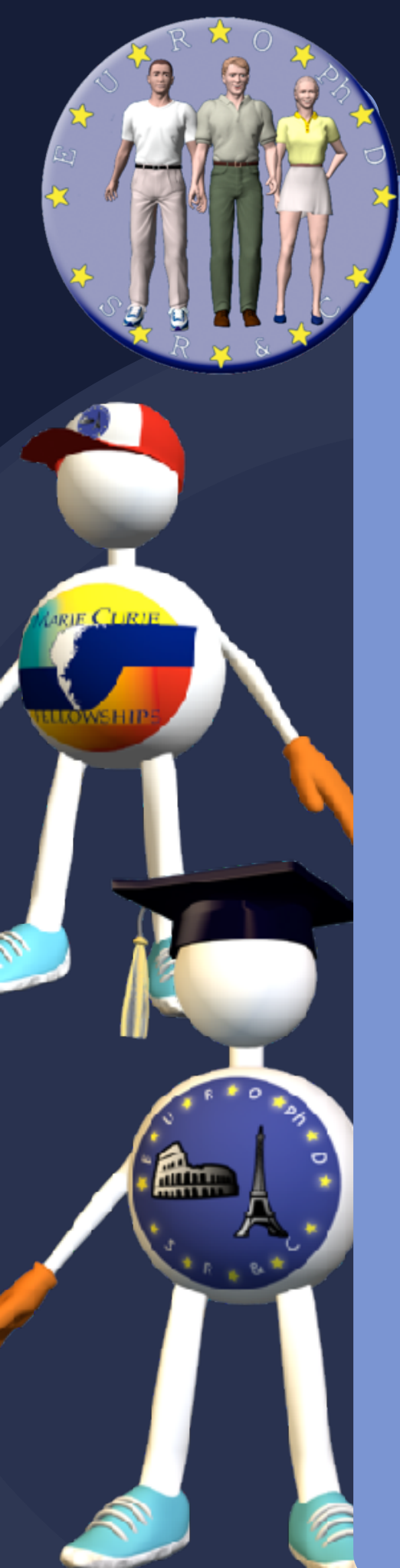
Lessons Learnt from the long running program

- ★lack of funds for research and education in the period of the global economic crisis and the
- ★need – even in regular time – to look for complementary funds in order to make realistic and sustainable the ambitious enterprise **avoiding to charge high fees on the doctoral trainees**
- ★changes at the network level in leadership and partnership and dynamic interplay between individual and institutional collaborations, both very relevant especially in a **program born from a bottom-up approach** aimed at creating synergies in research training by collaborative researches among an international community of scientists interested to develop the scientific field involving doctoral trainees - and **brought to top institutional level** in order to ensure legal validity of the joint degree and institutionalised processes in a long-term perspective



Lessons Learnt from the long running program

- ★changes of the legal framework and normative dispositions in different countries allowing various degree of autonomy to Universities. In some States with centralised higher education system – in case of intervening contrast - need to align coherently the inter-institutional agreements (just an example the recent abolition of the tuition fees for doctoral candidates in Italy)
- ★different interpretations and operationalisation of the EC policies about innovative doctorates and misinterpretation of the needed steps to ensure legal value of the joint degree at each national level
- ★different assessment system and accreditation of the doctorates over the world using different criteria and indicators also when evaluating the same dimension: one example for all, the scientific productivity of the members of the International Scientific Board and Teaching Staff



Lessons Learnt from the long running program



★**different time-to-degree** for doctoral research trainees who are already engaged in a doctoral programme at their own university and are accepted for the International joint PhD if coming from countries where enrolment in two doctorates at the same time is permitted at specific conditions. In this case there is a need to adopt solutions for the best time to be enrolled in the international PhD: if for example in Canada the traditional PhD at u-Ottawa is 4 years, to harmonise the time-to-degree the best would be to be enrolled in the 3-years International Joint PhD when the doctoral trainee is at the 2nd year at his home institution.

Perhaps **some of these difficulties will disappear when the perception of minority (even in terms of the excellent exception) will be overcome** by the wider spread of these doctorates.

Their coexistence - alongside equally excellent traditional doctorates operating at a single institution - should be more peaceful and in a certain sense "**normalized**".





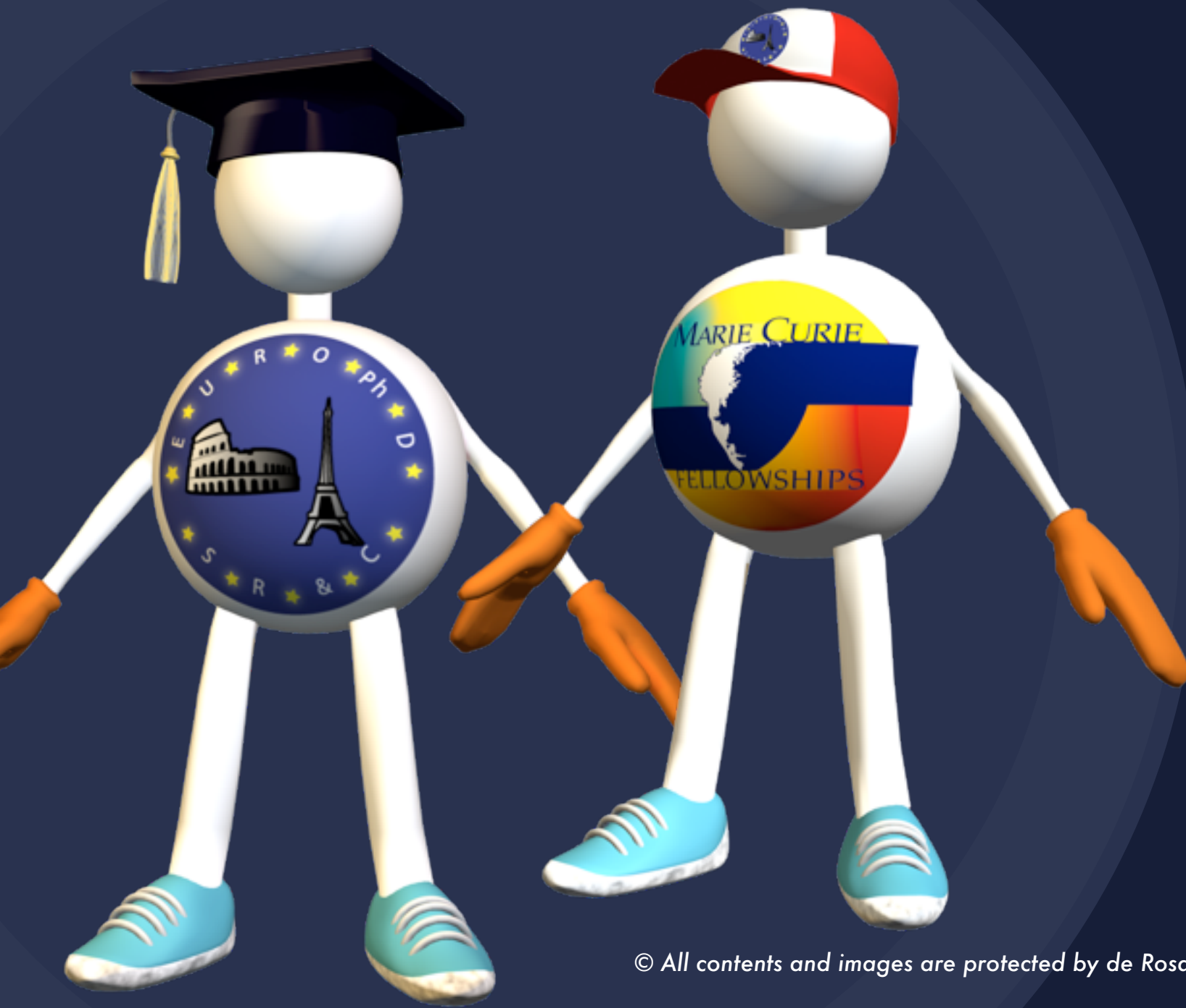
