

Challenges of recognition in higher education

Students` perspective

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1. Diploma supplement

- 22% do not know and 14% do not have any national legislation regarding the European Diploma Supplement
- 25% do not know and 14% say that the Diploma supplement is NOT FREE OF CHARGE



2. Recognition of foreign diplomas, credits and qualifications

- Foreign diplomas` recognition regulated exclusively by ENIC-NARIC centres (32%) governmental institutions (22%), and HEIs (14%) or shared by ENIC-NARIC and GI (8%), ENIC-NARIC and HEIs (14%), or GI and HEIs (3%), the rest does not know
- Recognition of foreign credits regulated mostly by HEIs (51%), or shared between the stakeholders (16%), then ENIC-NARIC and GI (each 11%)
- Qualifications are mostly recognized through ENIC-NARIC (19%), by the GI (16%) or shared between ENIC-NARIC and HEIs (14%)





Figure 7.3: Main barriers to recognition of prior learning

Lack of trust in the validation of qualifications	25
Limited information and a lack of trust among main stakeholders	22
Lack of resources / Cost of RPL	15
Lack of interest by the government in making this happen	12
Legislation limiting it or not allowing it	11
National Qualification Frameworks (NQF) have not been implemented nor their potential has been used fully for RPL	6
None, we do not understand why it is not in place yet	2



4. Improvement areas

- Automatic recognition of students` credits during the mobility time with the institutions that the HEI has a collaboration agreement with
- Automatic recognition (moderately to extremely important to 86% of participants)
- Long recognition procedures
- Recognition of competencies from the non-EU countries
- Recognition of prior learning still not established in many countries! (mostly due to the lack of trust)
- NQF development
- Consistency in recognition procedures



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
