


Introduction

- In 2019, Poland launched a new doctoral education system through the establishment of *doctoral schools* to replace the previous system called *doctoral* studies
- Among the significant changes brought by this legislation was the introduction of **external quality assurance system** for these institutions
- By 2020, we started to organize an informal community of practice by arranging monthly meetings of doctoral school directors to encourage collaboration and the exchange of varied data and best practices
- Subsequently, in 2023, we initiated a formal organization which presently comprises over 40 doctoral schools across Poland
- The **Polish Ministry of Higher Education** collects in **special database** called POLON various data from universities including **data on doctoral education**



Doctoral Schools vs. Doctoral Studies

Doctoral Schools

- Scholarship:


- Mandatory scholarship for all PhD students
- Quite high amount based on the professor salary (37% before mid-term evaluation and 57% after mid-term evaluation)
- Social insurance included
- Tuition free for all doctoral students
- Supervisor assigned after 3 months
- Individual research plan after 12 months
- Mid-term evaluation after 24 months
- Evaluation of doctoral school every 6 years

Doctoral Studies

- Scholarship

- Not all PhD students receive scholarship
- Quite low amount
- No social insurance
- Tuition fee for foreigners
- Supervisor assigned after 24 months


Number of Doctoral Students in Poland



Number of Doctoral Students in Poland 2022 vs. 2014 – Various Universities


■ Number of doctoral student (doctoral studies) in 2014

Evaluation of Doctoral School – Main Aspects

- The evaluation is carried out by the Science Evaluation Committee at least every six years
- Main goals:
 - Evaluate the conditions for scientific development created for doctoral students
 - Verify the ways in which the knowledge and skills as well as the social competences are acquired by doctoral students
 - Provide feedback on the functioning of the doctoral schools as well as disseminating this information in the public space

Evaluation Criteria of Doctoral School

- The adequacy of the curriculum and individual research plans to the learning outcomes for qualifications at level 8 of the Polish Qualifications Framework (PQF) and their implementation
- 2. The manner of verifying the learning outcomes for qualifications at PQF level 8,
- 3. Qualifications of academic teachers or academic staff working at a doctoral school
- 4. The quality of the recruitment process
- 5. The quality of scientific or artistic guidance as well as support in research
- 6. The reliability of the mid-term assessment
- 7. Internationalisation
- 8. The effectiveness of doctoral education

National Association of Doctoral Schools


- 2019. Launching the operation of doctoral schools in Poland
- **2020.** Creation of a **community of practice** gathering directors of **26 doctoral schools** in the social sciences to fill the information gap due to lack of Polish experience
- **2020-2024.** Growing importance and interest of the community of practice. Regular **monthly meetings, sharing knowledge and experiences**, solving current problems. Currently, about 60 directors of doctoral schools attend each meeting
- 2023. We established a National Association of Doctoral Schools (40 signatories)
- 2023. First National Conference of Doctoral Schools in Lodz (60 particpants)
- 2024. Second National Conference of Doctoral Schools in Warsaw (120 particpants)
- **2024.** Cooperation with the Ministry of Science and Higher Education. We prepared a report *"Legal regulations for the operation of doctoral schools recommendations for change"*



2024 Conference Participants – Overview


158 doctoral schools in Poland	17400 doctoral students at doctoral schools in Poland


number of doctoral schools (number of doctoral students)



2024 Conference Participants Number of doctoral students




2024 Conference Participants Percentage of foreign doctoral students




2024 Conference Survey Trainings for supervisors

Are there dedicated trainings for supervisors at the doctoral school you represent?




2024 Conference Survey Number of doctoral students that a supervisor can accept for supervision

How are doctoral student-supervisor conflict situations resolved?

- **Mediation**; conversation with the doctoral student and supervisor, if further cooperation is impossible **change of supervisor** at the request of the doctoral student
- Conflict situations between doctoral student and supervisor are resolved through discussions with both parties, which are carried out by the dean of the doctoral school and the head of the educational discipline. If this is not enough, ta **university mediator** tries to resolve the conflict. If the conflict cannot be resolved, then the doctoral student can apply for a **change of supervisor**
- Based on *mediation* or ethics committee
- Each situation is treated individually, depending on the problems raised. There are **regulations for resolving conflicts** concerning doctoral students, which were prepared in consultation with the Doctoral Students Council. In addition, support is provided by the **Doctoral Student Ombudsman**
- A conflict resolution procedure has been developed
