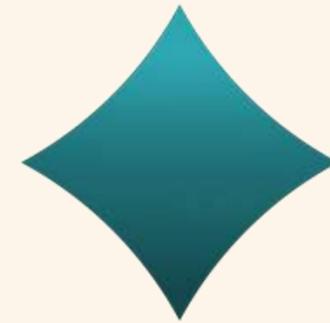

The BP4LnT project

- Bologna Process for Learning & Teaching;
- Erasmus+ co-funded, 2025-2027;
- Coordinated by EURASHE, in partnership with EUA, ESU and Algebra Bernays University (HR);
- Explores implementation of SCL and lifelong learning across the EHEA;
- Focus group findings will feed into playbook (launch end of 2026/early 2027).



Student-centred learning in the EHEA



- Education geared towards student learning and success
- Education provision defined by intended learning outcomes and most fit-for-purpose learning process
- Taking into account the student's individual background and ensuring they take part in shaping the learning process
- Defined by “new approaches to teaching and learning, effective support and guidance structures and a curriculum focused more clearly on the learner [...] leading to high quality, flexible and more individually tailored learning paths”



1.3 Student-centred learning, teaching and assessment
Institutions should ensure that the programmes are delivered in a way that encourages students to take an active role in creating the learning process, and that the assessment of students reflects this approach.

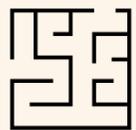
How the concept seems to have evolved...

Students in all their dimensions/aspects: attention to wellbeing and “care”

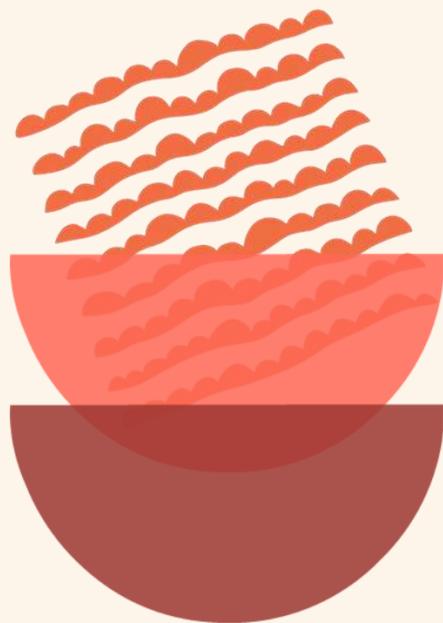


Individuals can move forward and innovate; what about the system? The curriculum?

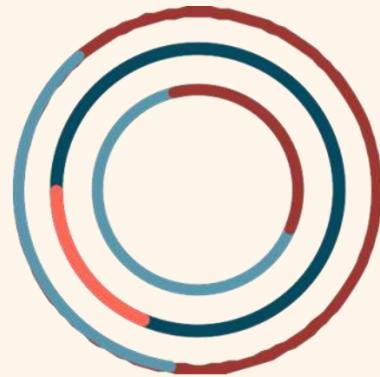
