ABSTRACT

Open Networked Learning (ONL) is a collaborative open online course for higher education educators worldwide, focusing on open education, collaborative learning, and course design. The interorganizational course welcomes both institutional and open learners from around 30 nations. Delivered 17 times since 2014 with up to 120 participants in each session, ONL employs problem-based learning to foster digital competencies and strengthen community development. Rooted in the European Framework for Digital Competence of Educators (DigCompEdu), a study involving 48 participants revealed statistically significant, across-the-board competence enhancement post-course, affirming ONL's efficacy. The article also summarizes our experiences and learnings from participating in and organising the course over the past ten years.

Introduction

Academic development programs in higher education have been established and systematically investigated for decades (Amundsen & Wilson, 2012). Also referred to as faculty, professional, or educational development, they can take many different forms, both formally and informally, and include diverse areas such as technology-enhanced teaching, recognition of an individual's teaching identity, and partnership engagements with faculties and departments (Sugrue et al., 2018). Initiatives usually focus on three interdependent levels: the institutional, the program, or the individual (Hénard, 2010).

BACKGROUND

Open Networked Learning (ONL) is a learning-by-doing online course for educators in higher education who wish to develop their skills in designing and teaching collaborative online courses. It was developed in response to a growing need for courses dealing with online teaching and learning. Furthermore, it is a result of educational developers looking outside their own universities to collaborate within their network of colleagues nationally and internationally. Instead of each institution running its own internal course, the partner institutions collaborate on a common course that offers both internal professional development and practical experience of virtual mobility. Educators gain the opportunity to engage in learning and collaborating with colleagues from universities around the world in multidisciplinary groups with problem-based learning as a foundation.

The course is run in a unique collaboration between currently 14 institutions from six countries (Sweden, Finland, Germany, Switzerland, South Africa and Singapore) with approximately 100 participants per iteration. In addition, the course also accepts a limited number (20–30) of open learners representing, over the years, a further 25 countries. Institutional participants are credited for 80 hours of professional development from their own institutions. Open learners are awarded certificates for completing the course.

In line with its name, the course is offered on an open platform (WordPress) and under a Creative Commons license (CC BY-NC). All course material is openly available, and even unregistered learners can follow the course, though they are unable to participate in the community discussions

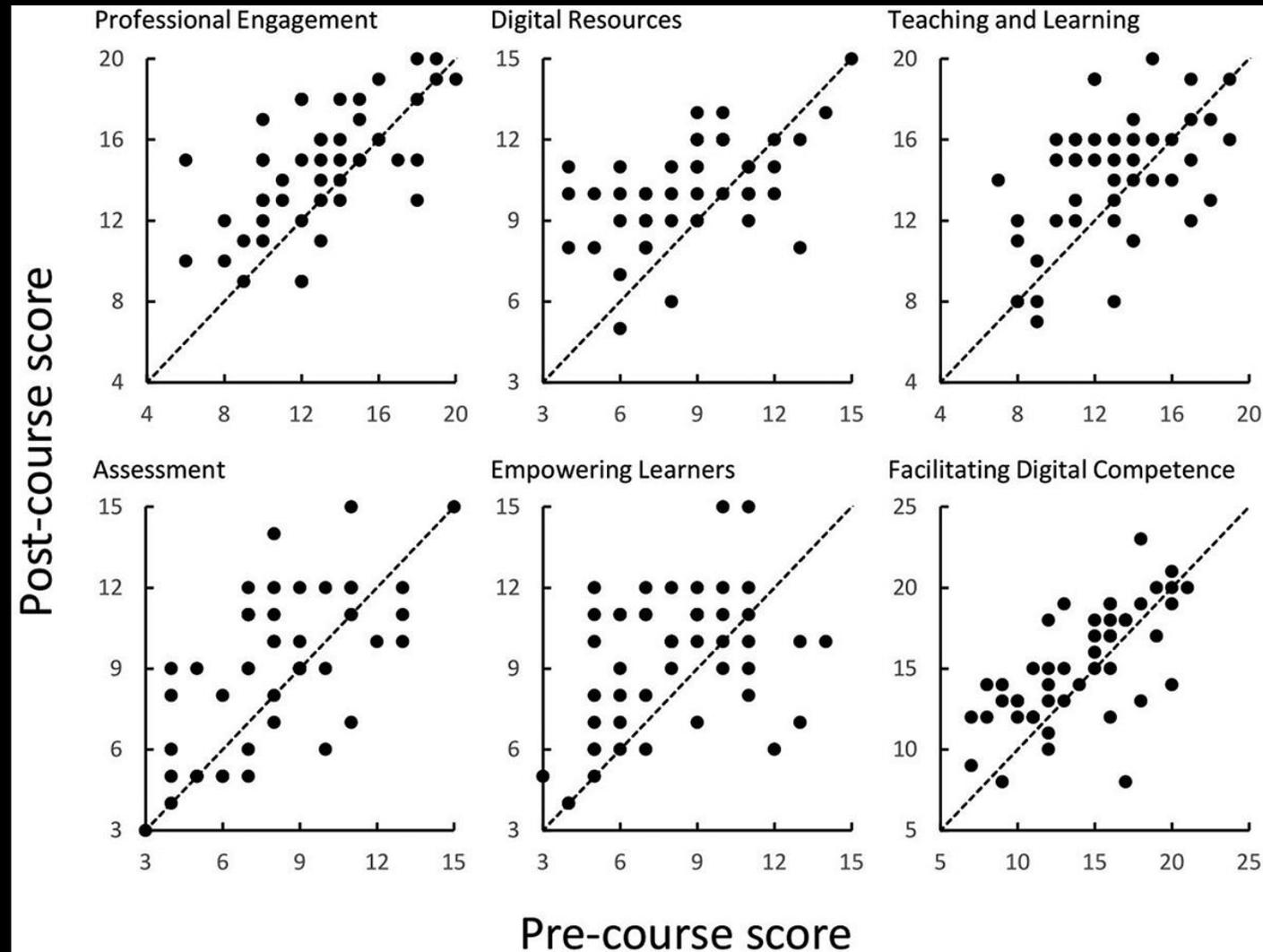

Agency

It gives you a sense of agency, or freedom of thought. And you start questioning the way things are done in your environment.

In the past, I believed that the education system is like fixed... and by participating in ONL... you see that things can be done differently

Reconceptualising teaching & learning

I saw that today... teaching is not sharing your knowledge with the students. I understood that... knowledge is generated by the people, by this group.

During the course, when I was a learner... I could see how students could perceive problem-based learning. That was really valuable — to learn from students' perspective once more.

After that course, I could say that the course changed the perception of teaching.

Experiential & relational transformation

It changed me also how you could work online, cooperative.

I have not myself been in a PBL learning situation... this was the first time when I went through the whole process myself.

I learned a lot about how you can take small steps towards something.

That was such a great experience. I had so much fun with my group.

I thought never ever that you could become so close to a person you have never seen. It is a safe environment.

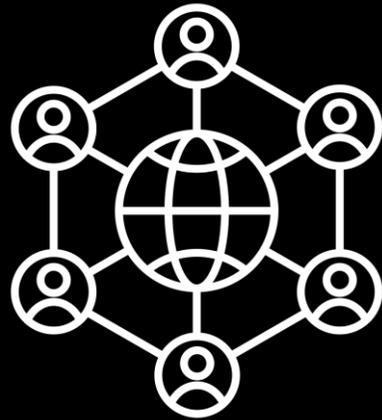

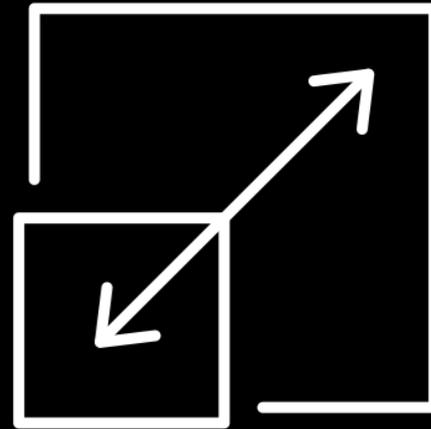

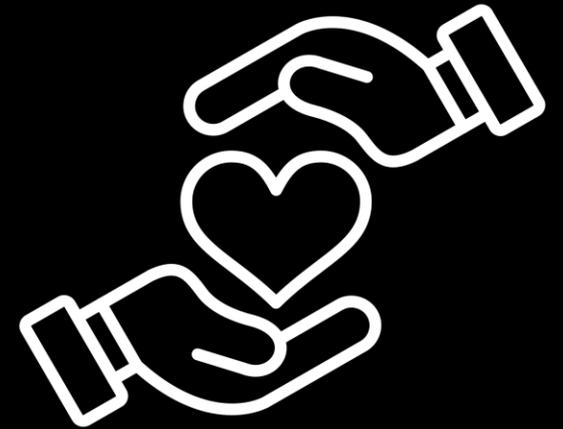

Challenges

1. **Institutional support:** Some HEIs view participation as too resource-intensive because facilitators must be provided.
2. **Participant diversity:** Global openness brings varied digital literacy levels, cultural expectations, and language backgrounds -> uneven engagement.
3. **Attrition and workload:** Online programs face dropouts; ONL mitigates this through strong facilitation and reflective practices, but participation still requires significant commitment.
4. **Recognition of outcomes:** Despite its proven impact, participation is not always institutionally recognized or rewarded. Formal requirements for teachers' competence development very beneficial.
